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**NOTICE OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S
REQUEST TO INCREASE ELECTRIC RATES FOR TWO
ELECTRIC TRANSPORTATION PILOTS PURSUANT TO
ASSEMBLY BILL 1082 AND ASSEMBLY BILL 1083
APPLICATION NO. A.18-07-023**

On July 30, 2018, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed a request with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for approval to increase rates to fund two transportation electrification pilots. Both pilots will deploy electric vehicle (EV) equipment in a variety of private and public venues. These venues will include school facilities, parks, and beaches. This request was made in response to Assembly Bill (AB) 1082 (School Pilot) and 1083 (Parks Pilot), which authorize the investor-owned utilities to propose pilot programs to install electric vehicle charging infrastructure at school facilities, state parks, and beaches. These pilot proposals will help the state meet air quality standards by reducing dependence on petroleum, greenhouse gas emissions and local air pollution.

The pilot proposals include two, multi-year pilot programs that will accelerate transportation electrification by providing charging infrastructure to support participants seeking EV chargers. The School Pilot will provide EV charging infrastructure at 30 school facilities and other educational institutions. The Parks Pilot will provide EV charging infrastructure at 12 state parks and beach sites, and potentially, up to 10 city and county park sites.

The requested rate increase covers costs associated with implementing these pilot proposals. Costs include (but are not limited to) charging equipment and installation, electrical infrastructure for charging stations, customer support, and staff necessary for equipment, maintenance and billing support. The total costs of the proposed projects are approximately \$25.2 million. The cost to ratepayers over the first three years will be an increase of \$2.4 million in 2021, an increase of \$4.0 million in 2022, and an increase of \$3.9 million in 2023.

The charts shown below illustrate the changes in rates that would result from CPUC approval of this application, compared to current rate levels.

ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical non-CARE residential customer living in both the inland and coastal climate zones and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see an annual bill increase in 2021 of \$1.02, or 0.06%. A typical current monthly bill could increase from \$160.70 to \$160.79. The percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the changes that you may see on your bill. Changes in individual bills will also depend on how much electricity each customer uses.

CPUC PROCESS

This application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge), who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents, necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary hearings may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These evidentiary hearings are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) may review this application. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC, with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. ORA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering.
