NOTICE OF PROPOSED INCREASE
IN GAS AND ELECTRIC RATES
APPLICATION NO. A.05-05-012

On May 9, 2005, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) filed an Application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking approval of its proposed authorized capital structure for 2006, to adjust its authorized return on equity, and to revise its electric distribution and gas rates accordingly. SDG&E filed this application as ordered by the CPUC in Decision 04-12-047.

EFFECT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical residential customer living in the inland climate zone using 500 kWh will see a monthly winter bill increase beginning January 1, 2006 of \$0.38, or 0.5%. A customer living in the coastal zone using the same amount of electricity would see a bill increase of \$0.57, or 0.8%. The percentage change shown does not necessarily reflect the changes that you may see on your bill. Changes to individual customer bills will depend on individual customer usage and the season.

The following table shows the electric revenue and rate changes SDG&E is requesting in this application. The actual rates approved by the CPUC may be higher or lower than those requested by SDG&E.

EFFECT ON GAS RATES AND BILLS

The impact on each customer will vary depending on individual usage and the Commission's final decision in this proceeding. If the CPUC approves SDG&E's proposals without change, the monthly bill of an SDG&E residential customer using 40 therms a month will be \$0.61, or 1.5% higher than at present rates, beginning January 1, 2006.

¹ Core customers primarily use smaller quantities of gas, and include residential and small commercial and industrial gas users.

² Non-core customers are the larger commercial and industrial gas users who typically have alternate fuel capacity.

THE CPUC WILL HOLD EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS

Before acting on our application, the CPUC will hold hearings to examine evidence and hear testimony presented by SDG&E and any other interested parties, including the CPUC's Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA"). Parties may offer proposals to the CPUC that differ from those we present.

After considering all evidence presented, the CPUC will issue a decision. The CPUC may approve rates that differ from those we request. The actual rates may result in changes greater or less than those described in this notice.

HEARINGS ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC YOU ARE WELCOME TO COMMENT AND TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HEARINGS

If you have a question or need further information, please state in your letter that you would like a response. Otherwise, no reply will be sent.
