CUSTOMER RELEASE AUTHORIZATION REQUEST FOR CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION PROJECT REVIEW

The California Public Utilities Commission "CPUC" regulates and oversees the energy efficiency programs administered by San Diego Gas & Electric "SDG&E". As part of that oversight, the CPUC has selected your project _____ for further review.

Representatives from the CPUC staff, including its contractors and consultants, may review all confidential and/or proprietary application materials, associated analysis, work papers, electric and gas profile information, billing data and Public Purpose Programs charges paid to date to confirm the energy savings calculations. The CPUC and its representatives may also opt to join SDG&E representatives at site inspections.

PROJECT IMPACTS

The review process may revise the energy savings estimates previously calculated by SDG&E. In the event your project is reviewed prior to the execution of a contract, the CPUC reserves the right to modify the energy savings estimate - and therefore the incentive payment - associated with your project. The CPUC review process is not limited to the pre-contract execution phase and could extend through the final project completion. If your project is selected for review after the execution of a contract, incentive payments or savings assumptions for the project will not be impacted.

RELEASE AUTHORIZATION

Your approval is needed to release all confidential and/or proprietary application materials, associated analysis, work papers, electric and gas profile information, billing data and Public Purpose Programs charges paid to date to the CPUC and its representatives. Please note: If you designated a project sponsor, a similar request was forwarded to them for their signature. The released data will remain confidential according to the Commission's rules contained in General Order 66-C and the Public Utilities Code Section 583 (referenced on page 2). This review is required under Commission Order and is not optional. If you do not agree to the release of data and project review, SDG&E will be unable to process the application and pay incentives.

OPTIONS

Program participants have a choice regarding how the information is submitted and reviewed. SDG&E can either submit all documentation referenced above to the CPUC and/or its representatives **OR** a request may be made to have the CPUC and/or its representatives review the documents at SDG&E's offices with SDG&E staff and designated project representatives present. Please indicate your preference below by checking the box that applies:

Option 1: I consent to have SDG&E submit all confidential and/or proprietary application materials, associated analysis, work papers, electric and gas profile information, billing data and Public Purpose Programs charges paid to date to the CPUC.

Option 2: I consent to have SDG&E provide all confidential and/or proprietary application materials, associated analysis, work papers, electric and gas profile information, billing data and Public Purpose Programs charges paid to date for review by the CPUC onsite at SDG&E with SDG&E staff and designated project representatives present.

GENERAL ORDER 66-C AND THE PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE SECTION 583

Public Utilities Code Section 583

No information furnished to the commission by a public utility, or any business which is a subsidiary or affiliate of a public utility, or a corporation which holds a controlling interest in a public utility, except those matters specifically required to be open to public inspection by this part, shall be open to public inspection or made public except on order of the commission, or by the commission or a commissioner in the course of a hearing or proceeding. Any present or former officer or employee of the commission who divulges any such information is guilty of a misdemeanor.
