



Bundled Electric Rate Increase Alert

On September 30, 2024, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed Advice Letter 4507-E to consolidate recently approved electric requests.¹ As a result, SDG&E's bundled residential average electric rates will increase by approximately 0.3 cents/kWh or 0.7% from 38.3 cents/kWh to 38.5 cents/kWh.²

A bundled customer is one who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from SDG&E. Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below.

Unbundled Electric Rate Increase Alert

On September 30, 2024, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed Advice Letter 4507-E to consolidate recently approved electric requests.¹ As a result, SDG&E's residential average electric delivery rates will increase by approximately 0.3 cents/kWh or 1.1% from 23.1 cents/kWh to 23.3 cents/kWh.²

An unbundled customer is someone who receives their electric generation from another provider such as a Community Choice Aggregator (CCA). For additional information on your electric generation rate, please reach out to your electricity provider.³ Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical unbundled customer are shown below.
