Pursuant to the California Public Utilities Commission's ("CPUC" or "Commission")
Rules of Practice and Procedure, Ordering Paragraph 3 of the Administrative Law Judge's
("ALJ") July 29, 2019 Ruling Setting Public Participation Hearings ("July 29, 2019 Ruling"),
and the ALJ's August 15, 2019 Email Ruling Revising Deadline to Complete Mailing of Public
Participation Notices ("August 15, 2019 Ruling Revising Deadline"), San Diego Gas & Electric
Company ("SDG&E") hereby submits Attachments A through F as proof of compliance of its
notice of the Public Participation Hearings ("PPH") scheduled for September 17, 2019 and
September 18, 2019.

The July 29, 2019 Ruling (at p. 3) requires that:

SDG&E shall mail the final notice to customers not less than 15 days before the date of the first scheduled public participation hearing. For customers receiving

electronic billing, SDG&E shall email the final notice not less than 15 days before the date of the first scheduled PPH.

Because SDG&E's mailing process for its customers takes at least 35+ days to complete, SDG&E sought an extension of time – from September 2, 2019 to September 6, 2019 – to complete its mailing process. The ALJ granted SDG&E's request in the August 15, 2019 Ruling Revising Deadline. Attachment A constitutes proof of SDG&E's compliance with this requirement.

The July 29, 2019 Ruling (at p. 3) also requires that:

[A]t least seven consecutive days prior to and including the first scheduled PPH, SDG&E shall cause the approved final notice to be published in one or more newspapers of general circulation in the general service area where the public participation hearings will be held.

Attachment B constitutes proof of SDG&E's compliance with this requirement.

The July 29, 2019 Ruling (at p. 3) also requires SDG&E to:

[P]rominently post a notice of the PPHs on its website and in all its offices where customers come into contact with customer service representatives.

Attachment C constitutes proof of SDG&E's compliance with this requirement.

The July 29, 2019 Ruling (at p. 3) also requires that "[a]t least seven days prior to the first scheduled PPH, SDG&E shall take *one or more* of the following additional steps to provide notice to customers of the PPHs:" (emphasis added).

- 1. Providing the company's visually impaired customers with a Braille copy or large font version of the final notice;
- 2. Posting the final notice on any social media accounts maintained by SDG&E;
- 3. Sending the final notice and contacting city managers, city clerks, and city councilmembers of the cities where the public participation hearings are scheduled, as well as other nearby cities;
- 4. Sending the final notice and requesting that SDG&E's authorized payment agents post notice of PPHs; and

5. Sending the final notice to city halls, libraries, recreation centers, and senior citizen centers and requesting posting.²

Attachments D, E and F constitute proof of SDG&E's compliance with this requirement (providing notice to customers of additional steps 1, 3 and 4 respectively).

Finally, the July 29, 2019 Ruling (at p. 4) also requires that:

At least five days prior to the first scheduled PPH, SDG&E shall file a document verifying that it has complied with these customer notice requirements, which shall include: (a) the date(s) the final notice was sent to customers; (b) the approximate number of customers so notified; (c) the date(s) and locations of publication and posting of the final notice; (d) additional information regarding actions taken to ensure customer and public notification of the PPHs as directed in this ruling; and (e) sample copies of the notices.

With one exception, the information previously-provided in Attachments A-F constitutes SDG&E's proof of compliance of the requirements set forth at p. 4 of the July 29, 2019 Ruling. With respect to requirement (b) at p. 4 – for SDG&E to identify "the approximate number of customers so notified" – SDG&E notified approximately 770,000 customers of the upcoming PPHs via paper bill inserts and approximately 910,000 accounts via email.

INFORMATION ABOUT THIS APPLICATION

On March 4, 2019, SDG&E filed its General Rate Case (GRC) Phase 2 application (Application A.19-03-002) with the CPUC, asking for approval to increase certain electric rates. The application proposes no changes to total revenue because revenue increases were requested and are being considered in SDG&E's Phase 1 GRC (A.17-10-007), filed on October 6, 2017.

SDG&E proposes (1) to gradually adopt rates that better reflect the cost of providing service and (2) a new rate class for public and charter schools. This proposed rate class is intended to more accurately reflect the cost to serve public schools in SDG&E's territory. In addition, SDG&E proposes to update how various costs are assigned to the different customer classes. The following is a list of the proposed cost allocation changes:

- Electric Distribution (the cost of distributing energy at the local level, including to your home)
- Electric Generation (the cost of electricity)
- Competition Transition Charge (CTC) (the cost of power plants and long-term power contracts)
- Local Generation Charge (LCG) (cost of generation power suppliers)
- Public Purpose Programs (cost of state-mandated programs, such as low-income and energy efficiency programs)

ESTIMATED IMPACT OF THIS REQUEST ON ELECTRIC RATES

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kWh per month will see a monthly winter bill increase beginning in January 2021 of \$8.26, or 6.2%. A typical monthly electric bill will increase from \$140.96 to \$149.07 from current to 2021, and no change from 2021 to 2022.

The dollar amounts and percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the exact changes you may see in your bill. Changes in individual bills will depend on how much energy each customer uses and when each customer uses energy for customers on Time-of-Use rates. Table 1 shows a comparison of current class average rates to proposed rates for 2021. There is no forecasted change to rates from 2021 to 2022.



Evidentiary hearings may be held where utilities, consumer advocacy groups, and other entities which have been given official status as "parties" will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These evidentiary hearings are open to the public, but only those who are parties may participate. The hearings and documents submitted in the proceeding become part of the formal record that the Judge relies upon when writing a proposed decision to present to the Commissioners for their consideration.

After considering all proposals and all evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the Judge will issue a proposed decision determining whether to adopt SDG&E's request, modify it, or deny it. Any of the CPUC's Commissioners may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision and any alternate decisions will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled Commission Voting Meeting.

As a party of record, the California Public Advocates Office (CalPA) has reviewed this application. CalPA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. CalPA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting, and engineering.
